

It was a great 4 days on the water with some picture perfect weather conditions and some good fishing competition which left the tournament open to a number of boats taking it out on the final day. It did go down to the wire in the end. Here are the final results:

We'll have a report for you in the next edition.






General tourist business definitely went a bit quieter in regards to shared charters but we went gang busters with private charters, a lot of them staff Christmas parties for local businesses. It has been very much in demand and increasing every year. So much so every Friday, Saturday and some Sunday's are booked out right till Christmas with such requests. The trade industry is behind this with a lot of male employees preferring a treat like this as opposed as to a traditional office party at a restaurant.

The fishing overall has been handy enough with some bumper days on the coral trout. Gee's they've become a really staple catch over time and ideally a top notch target species. We saw on occasions solid trout to 5-6kg one after the other so that's fantastic fishing in anyone's books.

Other smatterings of fish included large and small mouth nannygai, red emperor, cattle







dog cod, maori bream, cobia, morwong and spanish mackerel on the float. Then we had some big sessions on the gold spot trevally to 7kg which bend rods, peel line and put a decent strain on the angler. They always turn into a pretty hectic time on the deck. For many tourists or locals they rarely get to see what chaos is like when we tap into a school of these brutes.

One species which went on the quiet for us was the spangled emperor which prior was a significant player on any given day. The reason being, even I'm not sure.

It looks like we'll see a traditional pre-covid build up to Christmas with things bursting at the seams later into December. Prebookings will be absolutely essential to secure your spot.

## Saltaire Charters

November for us flew by quickly with quite a few charters undertaken. We completed all and sundry from family day trips to the reef, to more serious reef fishing efforts, popper and light tackle, heavy tackle, overnight and extended trips over 4 days. We were assisted by some really good weather which is always a blessing.

With so much going on our typical reef fishing days saw us have some big days on the coral trout in particular. For us it wasn't too hard to produce overs in this department. Most sized fish ranged between 3-5kg.

Our popper fishing across the top of the reefs saw us tangle with giant trevally up to 15kg at times but they were a little bit cagey this month not fully committing to the bite in our opinion. There was a lot of slapping at the lures as opposed to crunching them in typical fashion.

Our light tackle efforts made up on the surface scene and we caught a variety of good fish. Spanish mackerel, mack tuna, northern bluefin tuna, yellowfin tuna, scaly mackerel and a few big barracuda provided some really exciting moments for our anglers. The mack tuna and scaly mackerel went into the coffers to utilise as fresh skip baits for black marlin.

We did quite a few heavy tackle days with our best fish coming in at 500lb. We did lose one considerably larger but that is the nature of the game. There were quite a few hook ups to 200-300lb models which in fact are probably more theatrical on top of the water with multiple stunt acrobatics. There was a lot of other traffic on the water for the month with around 15-20 boats working the same area at times. We witnessed plenty of other fish being caught around us, sometimes in front of our noses. So there was enough interest out there to chance your luck at a fish of a lifetime.

We are rounding off the month with a tackle company trying some new product which will hit the market soon, so I'll report on this next time. Christmas and New Year look like being busy so contact us to tailor make a trip that is suited and very personal.

# Reel Cooking with Heff Fish in a Boat

#### **Ingredients**

2 fillets of whatever tropical fish takes your fancy - coral trout, nannygai or mackerel are ideal Soft Tacos shaped like a boat or a tub - easily found in supermarket

Brand Name - Tandaco Seasoning Salt & Pepper, again in supermarket isles

Baby Spinach - packaged in supermarket

2 avocados

Aeoli Garlic Sauce





#### Method

Coat fish fillets in Tandaco seasoning and cook in a shallow pan till golden brown, a good knob of genuine butter is required to achieve this.

Blend avocados in something like a Nutri Bullet machine with a dash of olive oil.

Once these first two steps have been done, briefly heat taco tubs in oven or blitz in a microwave.

Add raw Baby Spinach to tub, cooked fish on top and then a good dash of aeoli and avocado dippings.

Simple and mouth watering!!
